SECOND CONTINGENT MEN STILL WAITING

TIME—POSSIBILITY OF A BAT-
TALION HERE

In December 1914, the 96th Lake Superior Regiment recruited 127 men with speculation as to which contingent they would be attached to. Orders were given at the end of December that the men would joining the Second Contingent, Canadian Expeditionary Force. In February 1915, while the soldiers were awaiting mobilization orders to join the Second Contingent, the Port Arthur News Chronicle reported that they would now be attached to the 44th Battalion, Third Contingent, Canadian Expeditionary Force. However, this to would change with news in March 1915 that the Lakehead was to host a battalion for training.
