ADDRESS BY Lieut.-Col. CARRICK

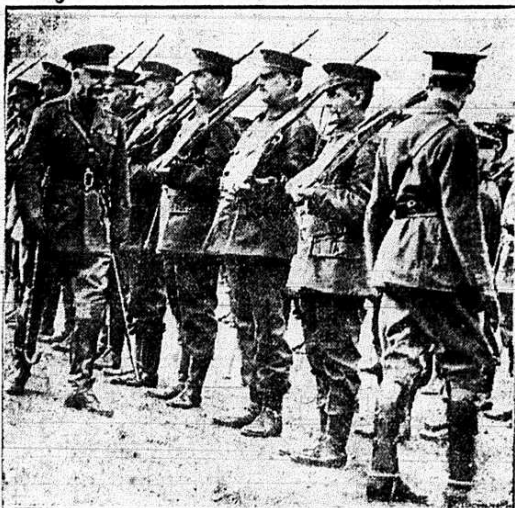
