

141st BULL MOOSE BATTALION

Early in November 1916, the Port Arthur News Chronicle reported that some members of the 141st Bull Moose Battalion would be mobilizing overseas. It was detailed that seven battalions from Military District No.10 would contribute 50 soldiers and 6 non-commissioned officers to assist with bringing battalions already in the midst of battle up to strength. From the 141st Battalion, 5 soldiers and 1 N.C.O. would need to be ready to leave.

The previous month there was much speculation as to where the battalion would train. By mid November, it was decided that the battalion would be using the Port Arthur Collegiate Gymnasium, the YMCA gymnasium and the Finnish Hall for their physical training requirements.

Possibly the biggest news for the 141st Battalion was Lieut. Col. D.C. McKenzie being reinstated as commanding officer. This news met with great approval from the members of the 141st as they awaited McKenzie's return. On November 30, 1916 Lieut. D.C. McKenzie was greeted with great zeal from the soldiers of the 141st and citizens of both Port Arthur and Fort William as he arrived in the Lakehead to resume command the following day.
