In December 1916, recruitment for a number of military branches continued in the Twin Cities. While recruitment progressed for the Army Service Corps, the 141<sup>st</sup> Bull Moose Battalion and the Royal Naval Canadian Volunteer Reserve, another enlistment office was opened at the Prince Arthur Hotel for the 230<sup>th</sup> Forestry Battalion, based in Brockville, Ontario. This battalion was looking for qualified men willing to leave immediately for France.

AN OPPORTUNITY FOR THE MEN WHO MAY NOT ENLIST FOR ACTIVE SERVICE TO SERVE THEIR COUNTRY IN THE UNIFORM OF THE KING.

This is intended to explain the condition applying to the engagement of anyone who wishes to accompany us to France and assist in the building and running of portable saw mills, bush work or other branches of the Lumber Trade.

The Battalion will be made up of Millmen, Engineers, Motormen, Teamsters, Millwrights, Filers, Shantymen, etc. The lowest wages are \$1.00 per day with 10c for field allowance, 60c per day for board, and whatever other excess pay special mechanics are able to command on arrival on the other side.

### We Expect to Leave in January

This is strictly a non-fighting corps and good men up to 48 years of age are eligible. A man's wife gets \$15 per month of his pay, the Government pays \$20 additional, making a clear \$35 per month, with \$1.50 to \$6.00 for each child from the Patriotic Fund.

Any person wishing for a good trip with a good bunch of fellows and freedom from a long military training can not do better than come with us, the work is going to be light and interesting with a certain amount of leave.
