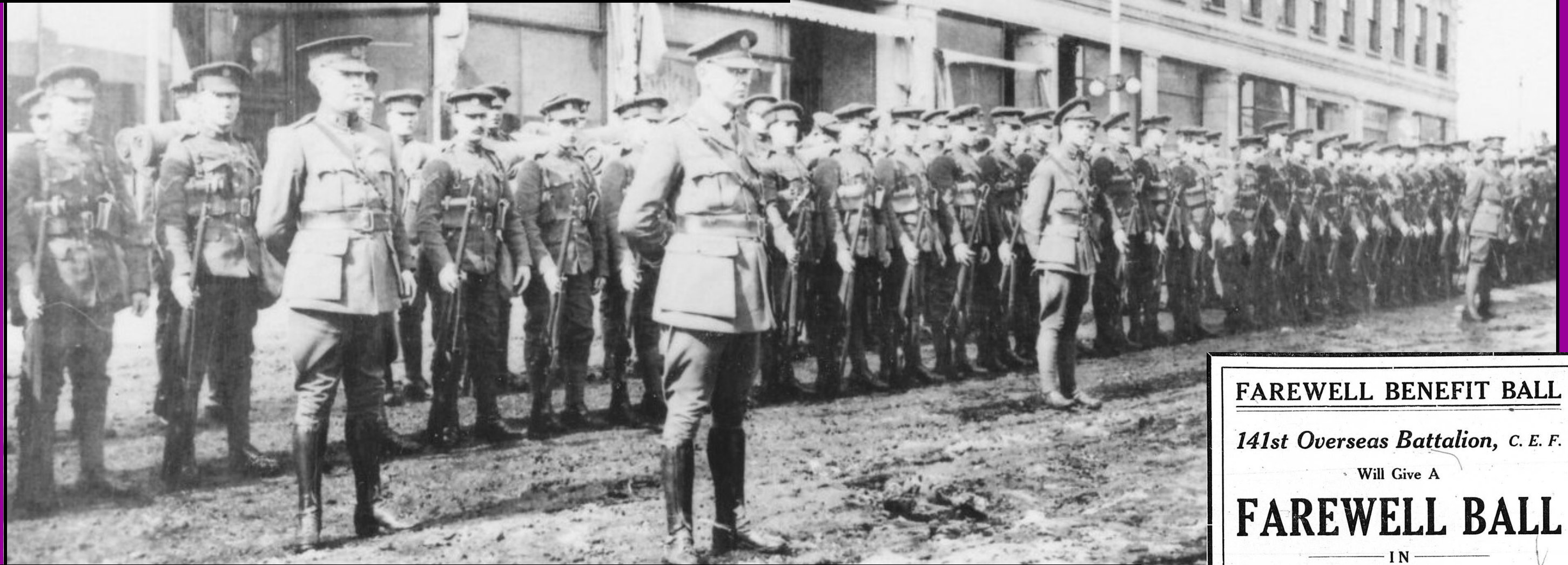


HUNDRED AND FORTY-FIRST BULL MOOSERS LEAVE EARLY IN APRIL

141ST BATTALION RECEIVES FINAL INSPECTION TODAY



After months of speculation and rumour, orders were finally received pertaining to the mobilization of the 141st Bull Moose Battalion. People of the Lakehead learned that early April 1917 would be the date that the battalion would leave Port Arthur. While the date of the mobilization order was certain, what was uncertain was who would be accompanying the battalion overseas. Newspapers reported that Lieut. Col. D.C. McKenzie, the commanding officer of the battalion, may stay behind to reorganize the 98th Regiment as part of the Home Defence Force. However, there was no validity to this report and orders stated that McKenzie would be accompanying his troops overseas. In late March, the battalion received its final inspection with high praise from Brigadier General H.N. Ruttan and farewell events took place for the battalion across the two cities.
