In early April 1917, the Port Arthur News Chronicle reported that the 96th Lake Superior Regiment, Canadian Defence Force would require 1002 men for the battalion. It was also possible that the first 20 men recruited would be stationed on permanent guard duty.

The Call To Arms For Home Defence

To provide adequately for home defence and release, as reinforcements for the victors of Vimy Ridge, the Overseas units held here, men are still needed.

Canadian Home Defence Force

Enlistment in the Canadian Defence Force is for one year—or for the period of the war and six months after if required. Clothing, equipment and rations provided as in the C. E. F. Pay the same as that for Militia on active service, with separation allowance for married men.

The call is for men between 18 and 45, physically fit and keen to serve.

MEN STILL REQUIRED FOR OVERSEAS IN THE CANADIAN EXPEDITIONARY FORCES.
