

LIEUT. COL. J. A. LITTLE RESIGNS AS MANAGER OF MOLSONS BANK

After thirty years in the service of the Molsons bank, Lieutenant-Colonel J. A. Little has resigned in order to give his whole attention to matters of private business which have been increasing in volume to a considerable extent during the past few years. His connection with the bank will terminate at the end of the present month.

Lieutenant-Colonel Little entered the employ of the Molsons bank at Trenton thirty years ago as a junior and when he came to Port Arthur as manager in 1903 he left Montreal where he was assistant accountant. Previously he had been at Smith's Falls and London.

During his fourteen years in Port Arthur Lieutenant-Colonel Little has taken a prominent part in public life, having been president of the Board of Trade and a member of the utilities board, previous to its recent re-establishment. He has become interested in various private business enterprises. He was prominent in the organization work of the Ninety-sixth regiment in its early days and a few years ago became its commanding officer, which position he still holds. Since the war, on account of such position, he has been actively connected with local military affairs.

Mr. H. A. Thomson, of Owen Sound will be Col. Little's successor.

COL. LITTLE RETIRES

**Well Known Port Arthur Banker And
Soldier Leaves Active Duties
With the Molson's Bank**

Lieut. Colonel J. A. Little, manager of the Port Arthur branch of the Molson's bank, has resigned his position, and will leave the employ of the bank at the end of this present month, to devote himself entirely to his many private interests. Colonel Little has been manager at Port Arthur for the past fourteen years, and has been for thirty years in the bank's service, commencing a generation ago at Trenton as a junior, and filling positions at Smith's Falls and London before removing to Montreal as assistant accountant, from which city he was promoted to be manager at Port Arthur.

He was formerly a member of the board of street railway commissioners in Port Arthur, and has always been prominently connected with the board of trade, being a past president of that institution. He has been closely identified with the organization and work of the 96th Lake Superior regiment, and succeeded Colonel Laurie some years ago as officer commanding, a position which he still holds. Colonel Little will be succeeded in the managership of the bank by H. A. Thomson, of Owen Sound.
