One who has held special interest is the former Miss Minnie Viall, now Mrs. Stephen H. Jones, of Duluth. Long well known as a philanthropic worker and as a prominent member of society, Mrs. Jones came to her own when the war started and she found an opportunity to work in the community where she lived, Duluth, for the people whom she loved, the Canadians. What she accomplished in the way of raising funds and socks and other comforts for the Canadians made her almost internationally famous. Now that the Americans are in the war her field of opportunity has widened and so has her activity. She has recently been appointed chairman of the eighth congressional district in the organization of the Women's Auxillary committee of the State Public Safety Commission. She was prominently associated with the Duluth chapter of the American Red Cross during the time it increased in membership from 300 to 2300, and which pledged itself to raise \$136,000, \$107,000 being raised within ten days.
